Roots: Parents Supporting Parents, Field Trips

Parenting Supporting Parents encourages parents of Roots students to plan and implement field trips that they want their children to enjoy.

It's easy!!

- 1. Choose a venue
- 2. Contact venue
- 3. Decide payment method
- 4. Write a small blurb, following the format shown in the examples on page 2.
- 5. Send blurb for approval to Jennie Van Hooft, approval designates the fieldtrip as a Roots sanctioned event!
- 6. Facilitators will send info to families
- 7. Take registration information from Roots families and collect the fieldtrip funds.
- 8. Take attendance at the fieldtrip and pay the provider for the Roots group.

Before asking this long list of questions, inform the contact person, that you are Roots mom looking to book a fieldtrip for the Roots home education group. Please note that some vendors have had bad experiences with homeschool group; let's keep fieldtrips open to everyone. We don't want to burn any bridges.

- Is there a booking deposit needed? If yes, is it refundable if the fieldtrip needs to be cancelled?
- Does the deposit get used towards the final bill?
- When does the final bill need to be paid? Sometimes it can be paid the day of, other times it needs to be paid prior to the fieldtrip.
- Is there a fee for students and or parents? Is there a discount for groups? Is there a discount for school groups?
- What is their cancellation policy? How far in advance can you cancel without penalties?
- What happens if the fieldtrip needs to be cancelled due to weather? If the trip is at an outdoor location, can it be rebooked at no cost?
- How far in advance do you need to confirm the booking with the final numbers for students attending? If the deadline for returning a deposit is earlier that the date for submitting final numbers, bump your registration date to several days before the deposit return date. This gives a few days for a call out for more registrations.
- How many adults are permitted to attend? Is there an additional fee for the parents or can they be counted as supervisors? Are there instructions for parents?
- What is the age range the fieldtrip is geared towards are they able to teach to a wide age range in one group or does there need to be multiple groups divided by ages?
- Can younger or older siblings attend? Sometimes places will only allow the age range for the fieldtrip, specifically no babies or toddlers.
- What will be taught on the fieldtrip? Is there anything the parents should talk to their children about prior to coming on the trip that would help them understand the fieldtrip better? Do you have recommended websites for information?
- Are there potential safety issues our parents should know to ensure the safety of the Roots students? Suggestions are appreciated.

- Is there information regarding the location of the fieldtrip that parents should have? Are there rules or expectations parents need to know regarding this fieldtrip? (Sometimes there are special requirements such as clothing (closed toed shoes) or hair pulled back in a ponytail if going to a food prep area.)
- Who is the contact person who will meet our group at the fieldtrip? Is this person the same person coordinating the fieldtrip during the booking process? What is the contact phone numbers and e-mails in case they need to be reached?
- Where specifically can the Roots group gather prior to starting the fieldtrip (in order for attendance to be taken and name tags to be handed out)?
- How long will the fieldtrip/tour take?
- Is there designated parking for the families to use during the fieldtrip?
- How much prior to the field trip time does our group need to be there for preliminary information to be given?

Examples of blurbs sent out to Roots in previous years:

<u>Weaselhead Preservation</u> We will be studying a variety of nature related things at the Weaselhead Preservation. We may talk about plants in a natural community, human waste and pollution or about the forest. We may even have a debate on whether or not to take down the trees to expand the SW Ring Road. This will be very much geared to whoever shows up. They are very flexible about what will be taught that day!

Fieldtrip Etiquette

Families participating in fieldtrips represent home education students in general, the Christian community, and the Roots Home Education Program. Parents, please be proactive in ensuring you and your children represent our community well.

- 1. Parents are responsible for the safety of their own children, but as part of a Christian community we ask all parents to be on alert for potential safety issues.
- 2. Make payment arrangements with the field trip organizer. If you cannot attend, parents remain responsible for payment unless you're able to find a replacement. Replacements are often quickly found through Roots-talk.
- 3. Respect the facilities' rules. Observe the guidelines given for eating, drinking, petting or feeding animals, and remaining in authorized areas.
- 4. Respect the age restrictions. These are given to enhance the learning for all children.
- 5. Be on time for all events. This usually means 30 minutes before scheduled time of event to allow for gathering the students together, taking roll, and purchasing tickets. Families arriving after the group has checked in may forfeit their event fee and be on their own to check in.
- 6. Be respectful and courteous to the speakers, tour guides, and employees of the facility. It is possible that they are volunteering their time. We want to make a good first impression.
- 7. Keep comments positive during the event. Reserve criticism for later. Use pleasant friendly language.
- 8. Parents, watch your children. They should not be left unattended. If you must discipline your student, please do so in a positive and private manner. If any students are misbehaving it is at the discretion of the organizer to ask you to leave.
- 9. Prepare your children in advance for the event. Let him/her know as much as possible about what they will encounter. This will help them know what is expected and encourage further inquiry.
- 10. A thank you note is always welcomed by places you visit.
- 11. Families are responsible for their own transportation to events.
- 12. Enjoy yourselves and build community as your learn together.
- 13. Thank your organizer for facilitating this event.
